Whetstone Savanna Preserve Come Celebrate Earth Day! Family Friendly

Saturday, April 19 9 a.m. to noon

Join us to remove invasive curly dock from vernal pools. Whetstone Savanna is a spring wildflower haven and home to two federally listed endangered plants, Cook's desert parsley and large-flowered meadowfoam, as well as threatened vernal pool fairy shrimp. The 224acre preserve protects excellent examples of mounded prairie-vernal pool, oak savanna, and chaparral habitats. A portion of the preserve serves as a vernal pool conservation bank where groundbreaking vernal pool and oak restoration is occurring in partnership with the Oregon Department of Transportation.



May Ashland Watershed Help the Legacy Trees

Saturday, May 3 8:30 a.m. to noon

Help us rake duff away from the bases of legacy trees to protect them from damage by fire (involves work on steep hillsides). The Ashland Forest Resiliency Stewardship Project is a nationally recognized 10–year collaborative effort to reduce the risk of severe wildfire and protect forests, water quality, wildlife, and people. Explore Ashland's beautiful forest and learn about the dynamic science and community engagement behind this project with The Nature Conservancy, the City of Ashland and Lomakatsi Restoration Project.



June The Table Rocks Preserve Family Friendly

Saturday, June 28 8:30 a.m. to noon

Remove invasive yellow starthistle from the top of Upper Table Rock (12 person limit for carpool to the top). Rising dramatically 800 feet above the Rogue River Valley, the Table Rocks are remnants of lava flows that filled the canyons of an ancient, meandering Rogue River over 7 million years ago. Atop these mesas is a mosaic of grassy mounds, stony flats and vernal, or seasonal, ponds. Oak woodlands, savanna and chaparral habitats support abundant plant and wildlife diversity including a number of rare species such as the dwarf woolly meadowfoam and bluegray gnatcatcher.
